

PRESIDENT MOUL: This motion is nondebatable. We will proceed to vote on the motion to adjourn sine die. All those in favor...Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I ask for a call of the house and I want all members present.

PRESIDENT MOUL: The house is already under call. Senators have checked in. We will proceed with the vote on the motion to adjourn sine die. All those in...Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: We are under call. I am asking that all senators be compelled to be returned to the Chamber.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Senator Chambers, this is a priority motion and we will proceed to vote on this motion. Senator Lindsay.

SENATOR LINDSAY: I just...the only reason I am raising this point is just because I think it sets a precedent for the future. We have, on numerous occasions since I have been here, on a motion to adjourn have had after that entertained a motion or a request for a call of the house. I think this request of Senator Chambers is similar to that, to that request. So I think in this case...I don't know if I have to ask you to reconsider your ruling or not, but I think we have done this on repeated times in the past, and I think we are just...Senator Chambers is just requesting that all members entitled to vote then be available for the vote, and is not making, I guess, a motion that would superseded the motion to adjourn. If we carry that, that ruling, then I think we can't ever have a call of the house on a motion to adjourn.

PRESIDENT MOUL: I will rule, again, the house is already under call. If Senator Chambers is asking for a motion to compel the members to be present, we are already under debate on this. This is a priority motion and we will continue with the vote on the motion to adjourn sine die. That is the ruling. Senator Chambers, your challenge is out of order. This is the ultimate priority motion. We will proceed with the vote on a motion to adjourn sine die. All those in favor please vote aye. A roll call vote has been requested. Senator Lindsay.

SENATOR LINDSAY: Madam President, just a...for the body, if I could ask, a motion to adjourn sine die, does that require a simple majority or does that require 25 votes?
