PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Conway. Does anyone wish to speak to this motion? I will remind the senators we are still at Final Reading so the house is under call. I would ask the senators to please be seated and I will ask for a check in again. Would the senators please check in. Would the senators please check in so that we can proceed with a vote on this motion. Senator Bohlke, would you please check in. Senator Beutler, Senator Warner, Senator Wesely. Senator Bernard-Stevens, would you please return to your seat. Senator Bohlke, did you wish to address this motion to reconsider? Okay, Senator Bohlke.

SENATOR BOHLKE: Madam President, members, I would just like to point out that I do not believe that the rule, although I am new here, but certainly the rule is not to compel people to return just when you have the people here that you feel are going to vote the way you want them on a motion. I do not support that and I think it is wrong. And I think we have some people on their way returning, as an example, Senator Haberman. And I think then, as a matter of for voting convenience, I think it is very wrong and I oppose it.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Bohlke. Does anyone else wish to address this motion? Senator Beutler, would you check in, please. And seeing none, I will recognize Senator Conway for closing.

SENATOR CONWAY: Thank you, Madam President. And in response to Senator Bohlke, mentioned this to me as she was moving to the floor, and if I misspoke, I meant to say that all had been found or that members are here who could conveniently be here. I know Senator Haberman, the last I heard, had been found but he had not shown up at the airport yet, and if we can proceed, the other senator who is missing I believe has not been found and located, that within all reasonableness, at some point those that can conveniently be here are here. Obviously, without question, if I was down and felt that I needed Senator Haberman or Senator Pirsch to cast a vote, I'd probably hang in there. That is a natural phenomena that we all follow, but I didn't mean to misspeak in saying that those two have not been found.
