PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Conway. Does anyone wish to speak to this motion? Seeing none, do you have closing, Senator Conway? Closing is waived. We will now vote on the motion to reconsider LB 15 with the emergency clause attached. All those in...I am sorry, I stand corrected. It is the Final Reading vote without the emergency clause attached. All those in favor please vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Please record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 34 ayes, 0 nays, Madam President, on the motion to reconsider the Final Reading vote of LB 15.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Motion is adopted. The motion now before the body is, shall LB 15 pass? All those in favor please vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Please record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: (Read record vote. See page 156 of the Legislative Journal.) 39 ayes, 0 nays, 7 present and not voting, 3 excused and not voting, Madam President.

PRESIDENT MOUL: LB 15 passes. Further motions, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Madam President, Senator Beyer would move to reconsider the Final Reading vote on LB 3.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Senator Beyer.

SENATOR BEYER: Well, Mr. Speaker and colleagues, due to business and seasonal business, I was absent this morning and could not participate in the vote on LB 3 and would like to have your consideration of the reconsideration motion. Thank you.
