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desk and would be glad to share them with you. But I think the simple fact is that Section 83-189 isn't complied with because not one member of the board has a professional background in corrections. Now, that doesn't mean that Mr. Renteria is not qualified to be on the Parole Board. It just means that the fact that the Parole Board hasn't fit the statute and we need to comply with the law. And the Legislature is going to be subject to a lot of criticism if we don't comply with the statute. And what might bring that criticism on? Maybe a judgment by the Parole Board or maybe, and this is a point that Senator Chambers I suppose, you and I sometimes, all the time, most of the time may not vote the same, but this might be one point that I would like to talk to you a little bit about on your time is that if you have an inmate who does bring a lawsuit with the board that has not complied with the statutes, (1) that is sure a point of litigation, (2) that may well be a point of relief. In other words, they could sue based on that there is an invalid board on the Parole Board and the state would either have no reason to hold the person, must release them on parole because of the technicalities in the membership of the Board of Parole. And the statute says you're going to have one member that has corrections background and we as a Legislature know that we don't have that and we've got an appointment up here and we know that it's not complied with, we in effect consent to that. I don't rise personally for Mr. Renteria. I rise simply because I don't think the statute has been complied with, and in good conscience I can't go along with that and I can't vote to confirm him because he does not fit the statutory requirements. Thank you.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Kristensen. Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Madam President and members of the Legislature, in the packet of information that Senator Chizek handed out is a letter dated June 17 from the Governor informing the Legislature that he had made an appointment of Mr. Renteria to the Parole Board. And behind that letter is one of these certificates. And it states that he is to be made chairman of the Nebraska Board of Parole and this is the language under his name, "reposing special trust in your ability, integrity and patriotism, I do authorize and empower you to discharge the duties of said appointment according to law. This appointment shall take effect on June 15, 1992." It takes effect on June 15 yet there is a memo from the business manager of the Parole
