budget. We have asked the court to reconsider this decision as well, but responsibility demands that we prepare for the possibility that revenue collected under LB 829 may have to be refunded. Accordingly, I am asking state agencies to immediately accelerate cost-control efforts. I have directed state agencies under my control to prepare for a potential budget cut of 5 percent during the current fiscal year. I will be asking other noncode state agencies for their cooperation to do the same. If the Bahensky ruling stands, or if the court delays action on the rehearing request, substantial budget cuts will be necessary now before the end of 1992. The Nebraska Supreme Court will decide, either by action of inaction, whether this Legislature will be called into yet another special session this year. But for the moment, you have done a great service for the citizens of the State of Nebraska these past two weeks. I sincerely appreciate your efforts and your willingness to work together to get the job done. Thank you for your hard work and your commitment to the citizens of the State of Nebraska. Thank you.
