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chose to say that was not within the jurisdiction of the Speaker. My point is that the body then went ahead and passed a bill that was outside of the call but it was okay because the Governor signed it and probably no one would challenge. My point is that there is no way, at this point, for the body to know whether it is outside of the call or not if the Speaker does not make a ruling, which he has set the precedent he will not. The only way to decide whether it is outside of the call is, (a), for the body, at some point, to vote that we are not going to do it because it is outside of the call, or the Governor vetoes it because it is outside of the call, and he is not going to do it, or there is a fear that someone, if the bill is passed, may challenge it because they would argue in court that it was outside of the call. So since we do have so many unknown questions, I guess what I would urge the body to do is to suspend the rule, allow the bill to be introduced, and the continuing dialogue can go on to say whether or not we feel if it would get to Final Reading, even if it would get that far, if it would get to Final Reading, then the decision on Final Reading would be, yes, we support the bill; yes, we, even if it is within...outside of the call, if the Governor signs it, we are going to do it anyway, as we did last special session; or, no, we won't support the bill, (a), because we don't like the concept of the bill, or, (b), we don't believe it is...we believe it is outside of the call and there may be some difficulties legally. That's, I think, the time when that decision should be made, but I think we should suspend the rules at this point and at least have the bill to be introduced to be decided on at...when we have more information on that.

SPEAKER BAACK: Thank you, Senator Bernard-Stevens. Senator Crosby. The question has been called. Do I see five hands? I do. We will now vote on ceasing debate. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. We are voting on ceasing debate, have you all voted? Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 1 nay, Mr. President, to cease debate.

SPEAKER BAACK: Debate has ceased. Senator Wehrbein, do you wish to close on your motion?

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Just very briefly, I would just like to offer the option of looking at this and I would...that is the reason for suspension. I would like to give a minute to Senator Withem, also, please.
