SPEAKER BAACK: Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. Chairman and members of the Legislature, this is to put this thing to rest once and for all. Senator Wehrbein listed himself as not voting and I believe his intent is to try to seek reconsideration at another time when he may have a chance to bring this tax increase in disguise before us again. I think the Legislature, instead of being disingenuous, dishonest, and cowardly, by taking the route of raising fees instead of forthrightly bringing a bill to raise the income tax, is something we ought not to do. I will never vote under these circumstances for a fee increase bill. I do not want it introduced at all, so I am trying to bring this thing to a head now and, therefore, my motion which is before us now, and I am not going to vote to suspend. I am going to maintain my position of voting no. And when this motion fails, the thing is dead.

SPEAKER BAACK: Discussion on the motion to reconsider? Seeing none, Senator Chambers, do you wish to close? He waives closing. We will now vote on the motion to reconsider. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. We are voting on the motion to reconsider, have you all voted? Have you all voted on the motion to reconsider? Have you all voted? Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 19 ayes, 2 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to reconsider.

SPEAKER BAACK: The motion fails.

CLERK: I have nothing at this time, Mr. President.

SPEAKER BAACK: Senator Schrock, would you like to adjourn us until tomorrow morning at 10:00 a.m.?

SENATOR SCHROCK: Mr. Speaker, members of the body, I move that we adjourn till tomorrow morning at 9:00 a.m., 10:00 a.m., 10:00 a.m.

SPEAKER BAACK: You have heard the motion to adjourn. All those in favor say aye. Opposed no. We are adjourned.
