a motion filed to suspend the rules. The resolution that Senator Baack and I have offered in this regard was not printed. But it is our understanding that the members of the U.S.S. Nebraska that are being recognized and commemorated here today are in the state, and hopefully will be coming into the Chambers yet this morning. And so I think it would be very timely to suspend the rules and offer this resolution at this time rather than wait.

SPEAKER BAACK: You've heard the discussion on the motion. Is there further discussion on the motion to suspend the rules? Seeing none, we will now vote on the motion to suspend the rules. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. This motion to suspend the rules does require 30 votes. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 30 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to suspend rules to permit consideration of the resolution.

SPEAKER BAACK: The motion carries. We will now consider the resolution. To Senator Conway on the resolution.

SENATOR CONWAY: Thank you, Senator Baack and members. As many of you may have noticed, we've had uniformed gentlemen enter the Chamber that are sitting back under the balcony, on the south balcony. These are crew members of the U.S.S. Nebraska. We, in this resolution, are commemorating these members, and especially the members that are Nebraska natives. And I'll identify those again. Mr. Alvin Tarrel from Kearney, Kirk Goergen from Dakota City, and Mike Dishman from Lewellen are three native Nebraskans who are assigned to the U.S.S. Nebraska. I believe all three of them are here today, and we can recognize those. But this is quite an honor for the State of Nebraska. You've followed it in the press that the Navy has christened the U.S.S. Nebraska in the name of Nebraska, a new Trident Submarine that is going into service. I think it's in our best interest and in the crew members best interest to recognize that we appreciate having this designation and we appreciate the crew, some of the crew from that particular vessel being here today for us to recognize and commemorate this activity. So, with that, I offer the resolution. Mr. Speaker, I might ask that the crew members all stand and be recognized by this body, and then maybe especially, since we are Nebraska, for the Nebraska delegation themselves to remain standing so we can give special attention to them.
