Senator Moore's motion.

PRESIDENT MOUL: The motion is adopted. Items for the record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Madam President, Health and Human Services Committee, to whom was referred LB 4, instructs me to report the same back to the Legislature with the recommendation that it be advance to General File with committee amendments attached. That's offered by Senator Wesely as Chair of the committee. That's all that I have, Madam President. (See page 81 of the Legislative Journal.)

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Mr. Clerk. We will then proceed with Item 7 on the agenda, General File, LB 12.

CLERK: Madam President, LB 12 was introduced by Senator Warner as Chairperson of the Executive Board. (Read title.) The bill was introduced on September 21 of this year, referred directly to General File.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Senator Warner.

SENATOR WARNER: Madam President, members of the Legislature, this is a bill, as was indicated by the Clerk, for the expenses of the special session. The total is \$85,056 which is anticipated as a 10-day session. It could be reduced in the event the session runs less than that. Three programs that receive the appropriation. Program 122 deals with the legislative...the senators' costs, the per diems and various mileages which is nearly 37,000. Program 123 deals with the additional cost in help such as the Sergeant at Arms, bill room, pages, which is about 9,300. The last cost in that same program deals with printing and office and telephone supplies at a total of 33,700, the largest item being 25,000 for printing. And then finally the Program 127, bill drafting, is 5,000 which would be primarily the computer time and costs associated with bill drafting. So the total is \$85,056. I move the bill be advanced.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Warner. Does anyone wish to speak to this motion? Seeing none, we will now vote on the motion to advance LB 12. All those in favor please vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted on the motion to advance LB 12? Please record, Mr. Clerk.
