number four you have to add one number to in that summary there and so the education is not number nine, it's number ten, in the actual committee amendments because we had a problem there. We thought it was one when it was actually two amendments. Going through the document, you can see the 16 or some odd actual committee amendments are summarized in the document there in the education. Obviously, the language, the corresponding language with out of state tuition...LB 19 and LB 15, go on on down and pardons and parole, the vacancy savings that is contained in this committee amendment. On down the list the difference in motor vehicles, where we suggest...well, we don't suggest, we do more than suggest, I guess, where we cut the money out of motor vehicles so they get the private firm for the driver's manual. And public institutions, our change is the across-the-board reduction. And we go on to page 5, well, LB 3, we have a corresponding number change in LB 1 that we'll actually have to discuss the whole state ward issue under LB 3. Going on down to the Military Department, we took \$698,000 out of the Governor's emergency fund to get that down to the historic balance of \$500,000 a year. Going on down to DAS, we put some intent language in that will basically force all agencies to be on the NAS on-line services by July 1, '92, and there is a corresponding 60 and \$65,000 reduction in the out years. Economic Development, there is a one-year \$65,000 cut in DED corresponding with some activity that DED has been involved in with NIFA that the committee had a little problem with. Going on to page 6, well, then the only...then the final changes as we mentioned before are the 2 percent with the across-the-board reductions. And so that is a very brief summary of what actually is contained in the committee amendment, were the things that if there is no change on page 4 through 6 that's part of the bill, any part where there is a change and it can be done without a statute or even if it does take a statute, the corresponding appropriation language is contained in this committee amendment. So, with that, I would ask for the adoption of the committee amendment and would try to answer any questions that any members of the body may have.
