and a point that we need to look at. But that's a point that we can visit next year. Secondly, the...as far as I can tell from the evidence that was submitted to us at the Appropriations Committee level that the projects that were being undertaken on the local level were good projects, sound projects, well thought out projects that, in all probability, could not be done within existing budgets. With the cutting off of revenue sharing...revenue sharing dollars to cities, the needs for some of these projects were delayed and the MIREF money enabled cities and municipalities across the state to do some of the projects. Thirdly, the concept of regionalism came up at the committee, which I...and I think it's a valid idea. One of the objections to MIREF that was voiced during the committee was that some of these communities are so small that the number...the dollars that they do receive cannot possibly be put to any good use. And that is a valid objection, I think, with some communities where the dollars they receive are, in some cases, less than a thousand dollars. But we did talk to the representatives of the league at that time about the concept of regionalism and amending MIREF to encourage smaller communities to group together into regional groups, groupings, and to utilize MIREF to do regional projects. And I believe that that is...would be a good idea down the line. And, fourthly, I do...would make a differentiation between this particular program and other state aid projects. Granted, state aid to municipalities was not cut in this budget. The Governor chose not to take a cut in MIREF and it seems to me that when state aid which is a general appropriation to...cities and municipalities do what they want, we have with MIREF an appropriation which is earmarked to infrastructure development. So it is not a...it is not like state aid in that respect. So, for those four reasons, I would recommend that we not take the cut in MIREF but that we take a very hard look at it next year and maybe find some better ways of funding MIREF and look at some of the bonding opportunities that are available through MIREF funding. One of the questions we asked of the representatives of the league that were there was, how do you utilize MIREF in your ability to bond projects? And there was some discussion about that. Apparently MIREF is utilized as a part of a bonding application but it is not totally reliant...that the projects are not totally reliant on MIREF, obviously, because of the potential...potentiality that the Legislature could cut the funding out as they are doing, potentially doing here. But bonding is a posi...utilizing MIREF funding for bonding purposes is a potential...
