CLERK: (Roll call vote taken. See page 82 of the Legislative Journal.) 28 ayes, 14 nays on the motion to advance the bill, Madam President.

PRESIDENT MOUL: LB 11 is advanced. I will raise the call. Items for the record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Madam President, Senator Ashford has amendments to LB 1 to be printed. A new resolution. (Read brief explanation of LR 3. See pages 83-84 of the Legislative Journal.) That will be laid over, Madam President.

Your Committee on Education, whose Chair is Senator Withem, reports LB 3 to General File, LB 15 General File, LB 19 General File, LB 29 General File with amendments; LB 22, LB 23, and LB 24 as indefinitely postponed. Those signed by Senator Withem. Judiciary Committee reports LB 13 to General File. That is signed by Senator Chizek. (See pages 84-85 of the Legislative Journal.)

Madam President, the next bill is LB 9 offered by the Appropriations Committee, and signed by its members. (Read title.) The bill was introduced on September 21, referred to Appropriations, advanced to General File. I do have committee amendments pending by the Appropriations Committee. (See AM17SS on page 71 of the Legislative Journal.)

PRESIDENT MOUL: Senator Moore.

SENATOR MOORE: Thank you very much, Madam President. LB 9 is a bill dealing with capital construction in the State of Nebraska. The body will remember that in the 1991 session, the body passed LB 760 which committed the state, it was a package of capital construction proposals for higher education in the State of Nebraska. In that proposal was about \$6.5 million to go towards the federal match to construct the Beadle Center. There was also about \$13 million worth of proposals between this present biennium and the next biennium to do a variety of capital construction projects, including UNO, University of Nebraska at Kearney, variety of projects at the Institute of Agriculture and Natural Resources, and Wayne State College. The total of LB 760
