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to talk and I'm going to talk about some of those things. But, right now, I want to talk about what my amendment deals with. Nobody who enlisted in the National Guard was bribed to do so by being told that the university or school they attend is going to pick up 25 percent of the cost of their tuition. Not one school or university, which would be impacted by this committee amendment, had offered this bribe to people to join the National Guard. It is a matter that was hatched in the Government and Military Affairs Committee. Whenever we wind up in a political special session of the kind we're confronted with now, all types of crack-brained notions and ideas are floated. We, as thoughtful deliberative members of the Legislature, are expected to shoot those down and save the introducers of these ideas from themselves. So this is one of those propositions trying to make the schools and the universities absorb this extra money which ought not to be taken seriously by the Legislature. I don't believe that the schools can take the hit to use a term that I hate, that I detest, but everybody uses it and understands it. I'm talking about that word hit. They weren't expecting to take this hit and they're not able to take it based on the crisis that we have been told everybody is facing in terms of having enough money to carry out the responsibilities imposed on them by statute and other regulations. My amendment does not do anything about the language that is to be reinstated, that language which is to limit the total number of people who will get the bribe, whatever form it winds up taking. As we proceed, I have the opportunity to discuss with you or share with you a conversation that I had with a member of the Nebraska National Guard. Funniest thing I've confronted in a long, long time. I don't believe that the state, which does not control the National Guard, should be bribing people to join it. If bribes are necessary, let the federal government, which puts up 90 or more percent of the money that the guard operates under anyway, offer the bribes. When it comes to assigning these people to locations for training, it's totally within the hands of the federal government. The state has nothing to do with it. When some members of the Nebraska National Guard were going to be assigned to Israel and B'nai B'rith, the antidefamation league, was selected to instruct them on activities and relationships in the Middle East, I objected to it. I objected to their being sent there and I objected to their being instructed by an agency which is a Zionist organization. Now, the Zionists believe that Israel was given to them by God and they have the right to do anything necessary to take that land, they have a divine right to it. If people want to believe that, fine. But when people
