inducement should be reduced. Senator Wehrbein, when I used the term bribe, I used it advisedly, not in the sense of trying to get somebody to do that which is considered illegal but rather an inducement, something more though than just the ordinary inducement which is what a salary and conditions of employment would be. This is something above and beyond because people did not want to join the National Guard. They didn't care about floods, pestilences, earthquakes or the invasion of Nebraska by the Russians who were considered the enemies at that time. They were looking for an extra amount of money that they didn't have to work very hard for in order to receive. The agreement and the understanding, Senator Schimek, that you can say these people were given to have is that in exchange for so many meetings they attend and being available if they should be nationalized by the federal government or called out by the Governor, they will get a certain amount of money. That's the only thing that they can really say they could look forward to. If there were an attempt to cut that kind of compensation after people had agreed to go in for that amount, I would be listening to things you're saying, such as apply it from this date forward. Recruiters, not only in the National Guard but the Navy, the Army, the Air Force, the Marines, I don't know how it goes with the Coast Guard, but individual recruiters have made representations that the law does not even allow because they're given quotas that they're expected to fill. These recruiters have a certain number of people they have to get into whatever their branch of the service is so they make promises that cannot or will not be delivered on. My office has worked with a number of young men and we'd do the same thing with young women if they were the ones who had been victimized in this manner, who had gone to active duty, had been promised that certain percentages of their school money would be paid, and it was not paid, but with the help of some of the national representatives these problems are beginning to be worked out. So even when a promise is made that should be delivered on, recruiters will back out of them if they blunder in the paper work and don't send all the paper work in. They will deny having made the promise and other things I could tell you about. But this that we're talking about was nothing more, Senator Schimek, than a recruiting tool. It was not offered as a means by which the university or any other school which people would attend could obtain more money indirectly from the state. The National Guard is not primarily an educational institution. It is not an adjunct to the universities, colleges or the schools. It's a quasi. at best, military operation funded predominantly and controlled by the
