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rendition of that, that money that they think they are losing, they are going to lose anyway, because if you cap the amount of tuition...tuition support that you provide for these students, they are just going to take less hours. And so the money is not going to be there. So it is money they are losing that they never would have gotten anyway. But I am certainly open for, and I think Senator Bohlke has an amendment to the committee amendments, so I would like to reoffer the committee amendments so that is in place for the Bohlke amendment to be considered.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Conway. We are discussing the committee amendments as they were offered. Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Madam President and members of the Legislature, the amendment that Senator Bohlke wants to offer at first was tied into the committee amendment. But the reason, and I think she would agree that that is not the best way to go, is because the committee amendment would still have that hybrid provision where 25 percent of the tuition is paid for by the schools. What she wants to do with her amendment is to say that up until July of maybe '93, she will give the exact date, maybe further down the line, everything will stay just as it is. Those in the program now will get the 75 percent that takes care of that obligation that people have discussed. But after that date, anybody then will get only 50 percent. Everybody will have notice that as of that date the amount drops from 75 percent to 50 percent. If we use the expediency of amending the committee amendment, the confusion and the complexity would still be there because the schools would have to ante up 25 percent. If that were the case, you would still be left with the proposition where they would get 50 percent here, but 25 percent from the schools, even after that new date. So what would give us a clean situation or a blank slate on which to write would be the stripping of the committee amendment. So Senator Conway is now offering the committee amendments as in the original instance. We vote against accepting the committee amendment. So either a no vote or a not voting will achieve that. We then have LB 20 in the form that it was introduced. Senator Bohlke would then use LB 20 for the purpose of saying that those currently receiving this 75 percent of tuition assistance would continue to receive it until the date in her amendment. After that date, then everybody gets the 50 percent, and it will also give us some time to review the entire program. But the point before us today that I hope we right now is the
