SENATOR CONWAY: I have no closing on this.

PRESIDENT MOUL: No closing. Okay, we will now vote on the committee amendments which are being reconsidered. All those in favor please vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Please record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 1 aye, 12 nays, Madam President, on adoption of the committee amendments.

PRESIDENT MOUL: The committee amendments are not adopted. I will recognize Senator Conway.

SENATOR CONWAY: Madam President and members, in the discussion, and there is a significant alteration by virtue of the procedures and process and the specific language, I would ask for unanimous consent to pass over the bill at this time until what we are talking about is put into the format that everybody can read and see and understand and know exactly what they are voting on. There is some confusion as to procedurally how the amendment is going to be written, and it is involved enough that it can't be a yellow sheet on the desk in a quick fashion without probably bill drafting making sure that that is the way it goes. And so I would ask for unanimous consent to pass over the bill momentarily for the time being, or whatever the Speaker would like to accommodate.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Conway. If there are no objections, it is so ordered. Okay, we will pass over LB 10. Items for the record, please.

CLERK: Madam President, Enrollment and Review reports LB 11 and LB 9 to Select File, those signed by Senator Will. (See page 92 of the Legislative Journal.)

Madam President, LB 14, the next bill up for discussion, was introduced by Senator Lindsay at the request of the Governor. (Read title.) The bill was introduced on January, I am sorry, on September 21, referred to the Government Committee, advanced to General File. I have no amendments to the bill at this time, Madam President.
