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some people may like to hear, at least to some degree, the best of my ability to answer. The National Guard is, in this state, known as the Nebraska National Guard. It is a creature of the State of Nebraska. It's under the command of the Governor. It is subject to federal government coordination so that the National Guard components may fit into a national plan for military action, if called upon. So, therefore, the training is offered by the federal government. It's coordinated very closely with the activities, through Joint Chiefs of Staff that follow through that procedure. But the National Guard is a function of the State of Nebraska, under the command of the Governor, who can then call up that National Guard to address concerns that may show in any given state. We talked about...Senator Chambers talked about national disaster. One of the biggest national disasters we have almost periodically in this state, somewhere in the state every year is blizzards. And in many cases if we can go out to the agricultural sector, National Guard planes have been brought on, and National Guard members have been used to bring in C-130's and open up the cargo doors and kick out hay to animals that are stranding and are dying out in the blizzards and storms. These kinds of activities fit very closely into the functions of what the responsibility of the Governor is with respect to some of those staff activities. But, yes, they are subject to being called. And I believe in many cases or in some cases a Governor may resist, if he thinks more are needed in that particular area. And in some cases they're proud to fit into that particular facet. We had many guard members who did get called up into Desert Storm. And I was a guards member who got called into Viet Nam, twenty some years ago, so I understand the process of being called up and being pretrained and ready to go, which is a major component of the forces. And it's kind of our state's aspect. It is true also that the reserves only get a 50 percent credit on their tuition rather than the 75 that goes to the National Guard members. The reserves and the guards are very, very much different. They follow the same training, but the reserves are not subject to the command of the Governor or feed into any responsiveness to the State of Nebraska at all. They are truly only federal and are dispersed across the country with other reserve units in that program. Quite a different unit, quite a different set of benefits and packages that go with those. I guess I'm of the mind of supporting Senator Schrock in terms of the bracket. We're in a budget cutting session with things in front of us that are attempting to balance the budget, or at least move in the right directions. I think with this
