because of the date of the application. Because of that, it would eliminate federal funding. And I would remind the body that we are not cutting off all benefits for those...for women during pregnancy, we're only cutting off...we would only be cutting off the actual cash payment. So there are other programs that we have to continue to have funded, and we don't want to jeopardize those. What the amendment would do, it just came down from bill drafter's. I apologize for not having a copy out to you. The amendment states, and if you look at your committee amendments, it would be an amendment to the standing committee amendments. It would be on page 1, strike beginning with "October" in line 2 through the underscored period in line 8, and insert "December 1, 1992". What the amendment would then do is to have the effective date of this act become December 1, 1992, meaning that the payments would continue through October and November of 1992, allowing two more months of payments, rather than cutting it off right now, or the other alternative offered by the committee, which would be to grandfather in anyone who was already qualified, set forth the problems with grandfathering people in. With that, I'd try to answer any questions you might have on the amendment to the amendment.
