SENATOR CROSBY: I just wouldn't...I suppose that's a correct assumption, but...

SENATOR PIRSCH: Well, it is really amazing to me that only 54 percent have fathers that are or were married to their mother. Of course, if these children have fathers, and we've gotten tougher on collecting child support, but where do you go to for child support if 46 percent of these children never had a father, so to speak. That, I think, is one of the problems that I have with this whole issue. Senator Nelson passed out the article about our illegal immigrants sent back to Mexico from the Grand Island area, who left children behind. They did not marry the mothers either, in fact, the mothers had other children from, quoting the paper, another relationship. I don't know that they were ever married with their first children, but certainly were not married when they had relationships with these illegal immigrants who now have gone...have been sent back and leave these mothers and children. The whole family value issue has been raised and I'm afraid...

SPEAKER BAACK: One minute.

SENATOR PIRSCH: ...politicized. But I think in this society we have done some of the things that have been incentives to destroy our family values and to destroy the family as we know it, where we have a support group of a father and a mother who care about their children. It's tough enough being a mother without having that kind of support that you gain from a father who is around, who has made a commitment also to the children that you bear. I...
