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can't take it. Oh my good friend, Senator Bohlke, will be speaking for a woman's choice, too. And we could go right down the list. Senator Lamb won't be here anymore, that's one less knot on the log that we have to worry about. And some of the others won't be here, Senator Chizek won't be here. Jerry, it's been nice to know you, but on some of issues I'm glad that you're not going to be around. But at least Senator...oh no, Senator Chizek is against...he's against a woman's choice, too, and yet he's voting against helping pregnant women. But see, men don't understand these things anyway and don't really care. The women are the ones who disappoint me, the women. And I'm wondering again whether I did the right thing as a member of the Executive Board in voting for that Select Committee. I feel in an abstract way I did the right thing. But I'm wondering if it was really something of substance, or if it also was a faddish thing because Anita Hill had fought against this Clarence Thomas person and the whole country was caught up in Anita Hill, especially women, and they all wanted to do something to show that this is a real issue...

SPEAKER BAACK: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...that has been brought before the public, and something needs to be done about the condition of women. But after the fad had played out, like so many fads do, we come back to reality, and a male Governor says, take that money from those pregnant women, and most of the women say, right. He says, take that women...that money from, and the women over here say, those pregnant women, they finish the statement for him. This is the reality. I didn't make it, I'm just commenting on what has happened. I didn't make any of you all do anything that you've d...you all chose to do it. You all have chosen to be in the position you're in, and I chose to speak about it. When I take position on this floor that people disagree with, you all try to lump me up and I take my lumps because that's a part of it. But mine are trifling compared to this. I've never violated my principles in the way that people on this floor are violating theirs now.

SPEAKER BAACK: Time.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: The vote I'm asking for is an aye on this motion.
