closing on the motion to reconsider. We will now vote on that motion. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Have you all voted on the motion to reconsider?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Record vote.

SPEAKER BAACK: A record vote has been requested. Have you all voted? Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: (Read record vote as found on page 104 of the Legislative Journal.) 4 ayes, 15 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to reconsider.

SPEAKER BAACK: The motion to reconsider fails.

CLERK: Mr. President, the next amendments to the committee amendments I have are by Senator Crosby. Senator, AM37. (Crosby amendment appears on page 105 of the Legislative Journal.)

SPEAKER BAACK: Senator Crosby.

SENATOR CROSBY: AM37?

CLERK: Yes, Senator.

SENATOR CROSBY: Thank you, Mr. Speaker. AM37, on page 4, line 19, of LB 20, strikes the effective date of this act and inserts April 1, 1993. Is this...this isn't printed in the Journal, I think, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: It is not, Senator.

SENATOR CROSBY: That's fine, thank you. All it says is that you strike amendment 1 and insert the following new amendment. On page 4, line 19, strike the effective date of this act and insert April 1, 1993. April 1, 1993 gives us a breather, and it would delay taking away the money until April 1 of 1993. That would give us an opportunity to study ADC again, to study the AFDC program and see if it is working the way that the people who instituted and started this program, back in 1982, thought that it would. So, from that point of view, I would think that without a whole lot of discussion you could vote for this amendment. All it does is delay the beginning of taking away the benefits.
