SPEAKER BAACK: Thank you, Senator Moore. Senator Wesely. Senator Crosby.

SENATOR CROSBY: Thank you. Senator Moore, yes, you came back and...I have a hard time with dates. You'll have to forgive me, I did state it wrong. Mr. Speaker and members, I have four children and none of them came on the date that I had thought they were going to come on because absolutely I can't count backwards or forwards, obviously, because I couldn't quite figure out, you know. So that's why I think I said this wrong. The effective date of this act, on page 4, line 19, if you look at your bill, after the word act you insert April 1, 1993. And yes, Senator Moore, you are correct, it moves it forward from November 1, 1992 to April 1, 1993. It would give us a breather, a time to look at the whole program and see if it's working or not working. So that's all that this amendment does. I hope you can support it. Thank you.

SPEAKER BAACK: Thank you, Senator Crosby. Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. Speaker and members of the Legislature, with an amendment that was adopted by Senator...that Senator Wesely and Senator Lindsay offered, I think that date changes from October to December 1st, so it would be...but it's a relatively small period of time, and it doesn't alter the principle of Senator Crosby's amendment. I wonder if the amendment is going to make Senator Moore kind of soften up a little bit. Senator Moore, may I ask you a question? And while he's walking to his microphone, I'll continue. There are bills that come before us that are not good bills, but sometimes amendments can be offered and added that will mitigate the damage that the bills will do. And I would agree to Senator Crosby's amendment as a mitigation of the damage. Senator Moore, would you, now that you understand Senator Crosby's amendment, are you going to support her amendment?

SENATOR MOORE: No.

SPEAKER BAACK: Senator Moore.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: He said no, I heard him, he said no. Very succinct.
