on this floor like to give you little vignettes of what might happen, or what might not happen. Here, I'll tell you one. A young farmer who's depending on that corn price may end up bankrupt, losing the farm. His wife is pregnant. He may say to her, well, I'll take off someplace and get a job, and you go into town and get some help from DSS. If you don't...this could happen now between April 1, 1993 and now. If this is not in place, if we take this program away for now and start it November 1st, she would not be eligible to get that payment. So I just hope you all think about that, because again I said to you yesterday, and I say it every chance I have, it isn't just an isolated group of people or an isolated section of Nebraska that this problem exists, it exists in every single one of the 93 counties. Please support this amendment, I think you'll feel better. If you support this amendment and it goes to the end and you vote for the bill, at least you tried. Thank you.
