SENATOR WARNER: Senator Crosby.

SENATOR CROSBY: Thank you, Mr. Chairman. Thank you, Senator Chambers, for asking for this reconsideration because I still think that this is a good amendment. And if you haven't looked at it, if some of you weren't here earlier, look at the bill, on page 4, line 19, what it does is strikes the effective date of the act and inserts April 1, 1993. And that gives us a breather. It doesn't change the ending date of 1995, I want to make that clear again. It's April 1, 1993 when it kicks in, when we take it away. So I do appreciate your bringing the reconsideration motion, because I think maybe if you would think about that, it doesn't hurt the bill that much. And if you want to vote for the bill at the end, which I'm not going to do, this amendment makes it a little bit more palatable. I'm going to repeat some of the things I said yesterday. And I passed around to you the myths versus facts from the Department of Social Services, and I passed around to you this in depth article from the Journal about the people who are actually on ADC. And the statistics are very telling, and I want to remind you again that we're talking about the State of Nebraska, we're not talking about New York, or California, or any place where perhaps there are people who misuse the system. I'm sure that there are people in Nebraska who misuse the system. People use...there are people who misuse every system, always, because human nature being what it is, there are those who try to get around the rules and use them in their own way. Have you noticed how few people there are in the Rotunda this morning. Obviously, there's just no big lobby for ADC mothers, and that's part of the problem. That is part of the problem is that we do not understand, perhaps, and don't want to understand because we don't like to dwell on the unfortunate, and we don't like to dwell on whether a woman is living in her car with her child, and you know that happened. It happens in Nebraska. On October 16th the City of Lincoln is going to have, I don't mean that the City of Lincoln is sponsoring it, but in the City of Lincoln there will be a sleep out for those of us who want to go down to the mall here, across the way from us, and see how it is to sleep out in October. I'm sure it's not going to be a whole lot of fun, but that's the kind of thing that brings home to us what people do who are up against it, who can't find shelter, who are too proud maybe to ask for shelter, or because of some
