SENATOR CONWAY: Will the Chamber please hold the noise down.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Why? They don't have to, but I understand for appearance sake. What you ought to do...the only way you are going to not do this is stop bringing the feeding trough into the barnyard. At least take the food out there and then they can carry on however way they want to, but we know what the Legislature is. It is similar to the infantry, which they say travels on its belly. The legislators are always eating, always drinking, somebody is always feeding them something, and I think it is very appropriate that free cake is brought to them when they are in the process of voting against giving that which is needed to these poor women. Who in here can say they couldn't stand with a few less calories, with a few less fat laden delicacies? Yet, look what they do. At the very time they are denying others what they need, look what they do. So it is, again, a situation, do to others what I would not have done to me. But that is the nature of the Legislature, and it will never change. But even though that is the nature of this place, when I chose to run and come down here, I knew what I was getting into, I knew what I would be dealing with. There is nothing in the way of qualification to be a member of this Legislature. You can listen to the kind of things that are said, you can look at the way the Legislature conducts itself, but while on that score, I have a sheet here that was given to me of all of the trips that members of the Legislature have taken, and as I look at those free trips, I see the names of a lot of people voting against this bill. So when we start talking...it got quiet, all quiet on the western front because I am talking about senators taking free trips and the amount they spent. Suddenly, maybe their mouths are full of cake now and they can't talk like they were before, but I am not going to read off the names because they have been printed before, I just want us to keep track of some of the things that can be brought to us and thrown up in our face while we run around here with the Governor talking about we are trying to balance the budget and cut unnecessary spending. I have been one of those, while on the Executive Board, who have fought to keep the Legislature's budget at what I thought was an appropriate and decent level for the Legislature as an institution. But when
