that. Secondly, I guess I would ask Senator Chambers a question if I could on the amendment.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Yes.

SENATOR ASHFORD: If we adopt this amendment, Senator Chambers, I am not asking whether or not you would support the bill because I assume you would not, but what would your strategy be, or can you divulge that strategy to us at this point on how you are going to react to these other amendments and other bills as they come up.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I think Boris Spassky would love to have Bobby Fischer tell him, at the beginning of his game, what his opening, middle, and end game in chess would be, but he wouldn't do it, so I won't either.

SENATOR ASHFORD: Well, I think it is an important issue, though, to know if...what Senator Chambers has been arguing for is that this is good public policy, that this amendment makes sense, that it carves out a program that is federally funded that 30 other states have adopted, and let me ask you this question, Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Yes.

SENATOR ASHFORD: If we were to adopt this amendment at this point, do you have any other amendments that you are going to offer on this bill?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Yes.

SENATOR ASHFORD: Can you tell us how many?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I am not sure. Some of them may have been printed because I have been offering amendments to various bills, and I wouldn't want to misstate the number. That is why I am reluctant to tell you the number but there are several.

SENATOR ASHFORD: And it would be your intention to, if this amendment passes, to delay a vote on this bill as long as possible.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Well, this amendment is not going to pass. If it passed, that would be the time to consider things such as
