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That's what the bill, Senator Lindsay's bill proposes and that's something I don't agree with. I don't see any particular nexus between starting payments nine months prior to the birth and the payments that are made and benefit to the individual. I think it kind of gets all skewed up and I don't see where the benefit is. But if that is the proposal that's out there today that we would have to continue those in two years or at least take a look at it in two years, as long as it's two years down the line and we have an opportunity next session to take a look at it, so be it. But again, I think that if we take a look at the whole budget, all the programs that we have looked at for selective cuts, it is not very often within that budget process that we have totally eliminated a program. We have taken, made selective cuts within programs and many of them very worthwhile programs and I think we need to continue that process. And though the Governor has a great problem, he had a great problem when he looked at this budget and he decided or proposed that we cut this whole program out, I understand that but I think that it is our job...

SPEAKER BAACK: One minute.

SENATOR ASHFORD: ...as a Legislature that we look very carefully at it and go through this process that we have been going through and are now going through to make sure that that decision to cut out the program in its totality makes good public policy sense even though it may make great fiscal sense as Senator Moore suggests. But I think there have been good valid reasons why we should not, we should come up with some kind of proposal that would allow at least the three month of ADC aid to continue. Thank you.

SPEAKER BAACK: Thank you, Senator Ashford. Senator Wesely.

SENATOR WESELY: Mr. Speaker, members, as Senator Chambers and others have said, we have been trying to see if there is a resolution to this issue. There's a number of ways it can be approached and a number of things to consider and I think we are going to find a way to work our way out of this. First off, keep in mind the original bill that was introduced by Senator Lindsay and myself on behalf of the Governor in a sense is a compromise because July of '95 it returns back to this status of being the one and only state that completely provides for cash payment under ADC. So in a sense those who support that continued policy do give up that policy for a couple of years.
