the last trimester, hopefully, or prenatal program. One way or another this issue will be addressed in the next two years. But it's unclear as to what the resolution of that issue will be. And again I think this is the best compromise we can reach at this point, and it's one I feel comfortable with. But the program itself is in need of further review, and we will be undertaking that review. Thank you.

SENATOR WITHEM: Thank you, Senator Wesely. I understand there is an amendment on the desk.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Lamb would move to amend Senator Chambers' amendment by striking the language through June 30, 1995. (Lamb amendment appears on page 117 of the Legislative Journal.)

SENATOR WITHEM: Senator Lamb.

SENATOR LAMB: Thank you, Mr. Chairman, members. I've been hearing several people on the floor express reservations about the first six months of the pregnancy. Now this amendment would assure that this issue is revisited, in that in order to get the benefits for the first six months this Legislature would have to act. Otherwise, with the amendment that Senator Chambers has offered, as I understand it, automatically those benefits for the first six months of the pregnancy would automatically be reinstated without any action of the Legislature. And so I think this is a better way to travel, and I hope you will agree.

SPEAKER BAACK: Thank you, Senator Lamb. On the Lamb amendment, Senator Wehrbein, did you wish to speak to the Lamb amendment? Senator Haberman, on the Lamb amendment.

SENATOR HABERMAN: Mr. President, members of the body, the new ADC cases involving a pregnant women, in fiscal year '92, monthly now, these are monthly average cases, was 169 in Douglas County. I'm showing you these figures so you can see why we compromise and why we want to keep the bill alive. Lancaster County was 54, this is monthly, this is monthly. Now let's talk about dollars and cents. Pregnancy related payments to ADC cases '92--Douglas County General Funds \$724,166.09; Lancaster County \$252,533.72.
