SPEAKER BAACK: Thank you, Senator Moore. Discussion on the advancement of LB 15? Seeing none, Senator Moore, do you wish to close?

SENATOR MOORE: I move the bill be advanced.

SPEAKER BAACK: You've heard the motion to advance LB 15. We'll now vote on the advancement. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 30 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, the advancement of LB 15.

SPEAKER BAACK: LB 15 advances. We'll now go to LB 19.

CLERK: LB 19 was a bill that was introduced by the Appropriations Committee and signed by its members. (Read title.) Introduced on September 21, referred to the Education Committee, advanced to General File. I have no amendments to the bill.

SPEAKER BAACK: Senator Moore.

SENATOR MOORE: Thank you, Mr. Speaker. LB 19 is another bill introduced by Appropriations Committee. It's only worth \$5,000. It's a bill that Senator Lamb somehow got this body to adopt several years ago that evidently we don't need anymore, that we decided it was time to do away with. Basically, what it is, and maybe Senator Lamb can explain it better than I. The original intent was there are out of state students attending Class VI school districts. And this appropriation would have allowed the state...required the state to pay 50 percent of the out of state tuition in those Class VI schools. It's my understanding that this statute has not been used and payment has not been disbursed out of this fund for several years. And so if we can eliminate the statute and find...take \$5,000 off the books this year and take it out of the base...And so, with that, I would ask for adoption of the bill which would repeal that state tuition payment provision.
