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would be impacted by the university, over \$4 million. I also wonder, Senator Chizek, I know during the hearing, what is the cost per student as identified for the Curtis campus?

SENATOR CHIZEK: Well, it is identified as somewhere between 8 and 9 thousand.

SENATOR WESELY: Eight and nine thousand dollars per student, and the total number of enrollees now?

SENATOR CHIZEK: We were told 177 full-time, 177 full-time students. I am not...give or take, and 25 part-time.

SENATOR WESELY: And at one time weren't they around more like 300 students, something like that?

SENATOR CHIZEK: No, they have never been that high. Back when we dealt with this issue before, I believe they were 45 students in '88 or around in there.

SENATOR WESELY: Was there also discussion, I know at one point there was the thought of the campus being utilized for other purposes, for instance, minimum security detention facilities?

SENATOR CHIZEK: Well, I mentioned that but I got some calls that told me to keep our Omaha trash in Omaha, so...

SENATOR WESELY: But we do have a crowding problem in that area as well, is that correct?

SENATOR CHIZEK: Substantial.

SENATOR WESELY: Okay. Well, again, it seems to me with the magnitude of the cuts we are looking at to not allow this issue to be laid on the table is a mistake. I rise in opposition to the committee amendments. I suggest that this is...I know we are all tired and wanting to move on to something else, maybe we should pass over the bill, I don't know. But at some point, something more than what the committee amendments offer needs to be looked at because this is an issue of greater importance than maybe we are giving it at this late hour.
