SENATOR CROSBY: Okay, that particular part of it hasn't been talked about? That particular part of it has not been talked about?

SENATOR LINDSAY: I'm sorry.

SENATOR CROSBY: That particular part of it hasn't been resolved.

SENATOR LINDSAY: Yeah, there will be, when the Parole Board functions are transferred to corrections only seven positions will be necessary as opposed to nine. So there will be two positions that will not be filled and whether that is done...it can be done either through no rehiring or not filling a vacancy. I can't say these two people will be eliminated.

SENATOR CROSBY: But also you are going to set up Parole Administrator, a Parole Administrator. Is that a new position?
