necessarily pertinent to what the Parole Board does with them, right?

SENATOR LINDSAY: I'm sorry, they don't duplicate what now?

SENATOR CROSBY: They don't duplicate the whole record because they keep a day to day record of each inmate and what he does and so on. So that isn't necessarily duplicated to the Parole Board.

SENATOR LINDSAY: I don't know. I will check on that, I can't say one way or the other.

SENATOR CROSBY: Oh, okay. Well I don't think it is. As I say we've been asking...I've been asking lots of questions and having a couple of conferences with people simply because of the problems we had fifteen months ago concerning the Parole Board and the Pardons Board both. If I don't vote or if I vote against this it is simply because of the feeling I have right now that we should let it stand until the new Parole Board chairman starts functioning and I would just feel better about it if she were given the opportunity to and...I have no idea how she feels about it. She may come in the first day and say, yes, lets do this. So we might know that by Friday whether or not she thinks it is a good idea. So, I may not vote or I may vote against it. As of this moment, I just have some reservations about the idea of moving that part of the administration of the Parole Board into Corrections. Thank you.

SPEAKER BAACK: Thank you Senator Crosby. Senator Hall, did you wish to discuss this? Anyone else wishing to discuss LB 13? Seeing no one, Senator Lindsay do you wish to close on the advancement.

SENATOR LINDSAY: Yes, just make the comment trying to respond to Senator Crosby's concern, that is is the entire file duplicated. It is my understanding now that it is not duplicated, however, point out, I shouldn't say that, a chunk of it is duplicated, there are several of the items that she mentioned that are not duplicated but 75 percent of what the Board of Parole uses to consider the inmates does come from the Department of Corrections. So it gives some idea of what kind of duplication we are looking at. It is a government efficiency bill, I think it is one that there is a definite savings on. I think it is good policy and I urge the advancement of LB 13.
