state in trying to use this as a revenue raising measure to face the budget shortfall that we have now and the concerns of the education community that money not be diverted unnecessarily from the permanent school fund. As Senator Withem explained this would cap the amount that could be diverted to the General Fund at \$5 million and if for some reason we wouldn't reach \$5 million by November 1, 1996 that money would go back to the permanent school fund regardless. I would urge your support for this amendment.

SPEAKER BAACK: Thank you, Senator Will. Any other discussion on the amendment by Senator Withem? Seeing none, Senator Withem do you wish to close? Waives closing. We will now vote on the amendment. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 30 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the adoption of Senators Withem and Landis' amendment.

SPEAKER BAACK: The amendment is adopted. We are now onto the bill as amended. Anyone wishing to discuss the bill? Seeing no one, Senator Will, do you wish to close?

SENATOR WILL: I would simply urge the advancement to the bill to Select File.

SPEAKER BAACK: You heard the motion to advance the bill. We will now vote on the advancement. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 28 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the advancement of LB 26.

SPEAKER BAACK: LB 26 advances. We will now go to LB 14.

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 14 was a bill that was introduced by Senator Lindsay at the request of the Governor. It was discussed yesterday. (Read title.) The bill was offered yesterday.
