Senator Warner do you wish to close? He waives closing. We will now vote on the amendment. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the adoption of Senator Warner's amendment.

SPEAKER BAACK: The amendment is adopted.

CLERK: I have nothing further on the bill, Mr. President.

SPEAKER BAACK: We are now on the bill as amended. Anyone wishing to speak to the advancement of LB 14? Seeing no one, Senator Lindsay do you wish to close?

SENATOR LINDSAY: I would simply urge the advancement of the bill.
