We're trying to work out to take just three of them and put them in an amendment because, I guess, there's probably three of them in here that are a little bit troublesome. But we want to make sure that we get the nursing homes taken care of and so we're going...Senator Wesely and myself are going to come up with an amendment that will be just taking care of three of them and we'll be back in a short time. So I would like to pass over it at this time. Thank you.

SPEAKER BAACK: We will pass over it. Mr. Clerk,...
