denied children, denied the parents, the mother of food, clothes, rent and heat. Finally we compromised but we still cut and cut and cut this appropriation. So in looking at LB 1 on page 171, lines 12 through 15, I notice where they're increasing, they are increasing additional faculty at the University of Nebraska at Omaha. So my amendment, fellow senators, eliminate that appropriation. They do not have to or do not get to hire the additional faculty at the University of Omaha (sic). We take this money instead and give it to those women. We do a lot more with our money than creating additional faculty. So I ask this body to support my amendment to remove from page 171, that's on line 12 through 15, the General Fund appropriation for UNO of \$246,250. Thank you, Mr. President.

SENATOR CONWAY: Thank you, Senator Haberman. Senator Nelson, your light is on. Senator Nelson waives off. There are no other lights. Would you like to close, Senator Haberman?

SENATOR HABERMAN: Absolutely. Have you received my other six or nine amendments up there pertaining to University of Lincoln, the University of Omaha? Well, they're on their way up. Fellow senators, I'm real serious about this. There's been a lot of talk and I wouldn't say that I'm doing this in repercussion to Curtis, no way am I doing it as a repercussion. I would not think of doing anything like that. I wouldn't, Senator Wesely and Senator Lynch. I would not say let's do this thing because one of your, I mean because there's a senator here who would like to cut out Curtis. I wouldn't do that. I would not do that. What I am saying is we are denying people through budget cuts who are hurting. Yet on the other hand we're going into Omaha and we're going to say to the University of Omaha (sic) here's \$246,000, hire some more people. Ho, ho, ho, now, you know, that doesn't add up to four; that adds up to three. And two and two is supposed to add up to four. So I'm just trying to show you in a nice way, I'll be nice about this, that two can play at this game that some senators are playing at this morning and have played at the last eight hours. So with those remarks, and be sure and keep them fresh in your mind, I'll withdraw my amendment. Thank you, Mr. President.

SENATOR CONWAY: It is withdrawn. Mr. Clerk, anything else on the bill?

CLERK: I have nothing further on the bill, Mr. President.
