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we are all in this together, and if we don't do this, there is no use in having the bill, I agree with that.

SPEAKER BAACK: Thank you, Senator Nelson. Senator Robinson.

SENATOR ROBINSON: Mr. Speaker, members of the body, we've been throwing a lot of figures around. I think my good friend, Senator Hall, threw false one out there. And Senator Beutler was talking about aid to subdivisions and so forth. This is a 1.32 percent cut to the cities. We're not cutting counties any. There's no money being taken out of the counties. What's the schools, 1.32 percent of the schools would be \$4.8 million. What are we cutting out of the schools? We're going to probably cut \$1.7 million on wards to the court. Now look at those figures. I think Senator Hall said it was 1 percent. I know how he is with his math, but he's a heck of a guy anyway. But think about that. Senator Beutler says we're cutting state agencies 1.5 percent. Well, we're cutting the cities 1.32 percent. Think about that, people. Think about it. We're cutting it whether you like it or not. That's the percentage. What are we cutting counties? We're not cutting them one red cent. What are we cutting schools--\$1.7 million on the wards to the court. That's all. Let's lay it out there, people. We're cutting cities more than we are the other two whether you like it or not. I support the Schellpeper amendment.

SPEAKER BAACK: Thank you, Senator Robinson. Senator Landis.

SENATOR LANDIS: Call the question.

SPEAKER BAACK: The question has been called. Do I see five hands? I do. We will now vote on ceasing debate. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. We are voting on ceasing debate. Have you all voted? Have you all voted? Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 19 ayes, 14 nays, Mr. President, to cease debate.

SPEAKER BAACK: Debate does not cease. The next speaker, Senator Moore.

SENATOR MOORE: Mr. Speaker and members, I planned to speak only once on this amendment and I'll say at the outset, of the amendment's filed, this is probably the least harmful. I mean I don't like Senator Conway's amendment. It's more of the same of
