CLERK: Senator Will, LB 4, Senator, I have Enrollment and Review amendments pending.

SPEAKER BAACK: Senator Will.

SENATOR WILL: Mr. Speaker, I move the adoption of the E & R amendments to LB 4.

SPEAKER BAACK: You've heard the motion to adopt the E & R amendments to LB 4. All those in favor say aye. Opposed no. They are adopted.

CLERK: I have nothing further, Senator.

SPEAKER BAACK: Senator Will.

SENATOR WILL: Mr. Speaker, I move the advancement of LB 4 to E & R for engrossment.
