SPEAKER BAACK: Good afternoon and welcome to George W. Norris Legislative Chamber, roll call.

CLERK: Quorum present, Mr. President.

SPEAKER BAACK: Thank you, Mr. Clerk. Do you have any items for the record?

CLERK: Just one, received a report from the Public Service Commission regarding the telecommunications industry report that's required by statute. That will be on file in the Clerk's office. That's all that I have, Mr. President.
