Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 10, I have Enrollment and Review amendments, Senator.

SPEAKER BAACK: Senator Will.

SENATOR WILL: Mr. Speaker, I move the adoption of the E & R amendments to LB 10.

SPEAKER BAACK: You've heard the motion to adopt the E & R amendments to LB 10. All those in favor say aye. Opposed no. They are adopted.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Schimek would move to amend. AM50, Senator.

SPEAKER BAACK: Senator Schimek.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Yes, Mr. President and members of the body, this is the amendment that I talked about on General File. The essence of it is that it would exempt any guardsperson who's already enrolled in the educational program, who's already enrolled in the guard. It would exempt them from the provisions of the amendment...bill that we passed on Select the other day. They would still be entitled to a credit of 75 percent of the resident tuition charges immediately prior to July 1, 1993, shall continue to be entitled to the credit at such rate for a period of ten years from the date of their initial membership. So the essence of this is that we would be keeping our bargain with those who enrolled in the guard prior to July 1, 1993. With that, I would simply move the amendment.

SPEAKER BAACK: Senator Schimek.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Yes, the Clerk just called to my attention the amendment should be 56SS. The original amendment that he referred to was printed in the Journal, and we had to change it because of some of the E & R amendments. So the amendment is 56SS. Thank you, Mr. Clerk. (Amendment appears on page 153 of the Legislative Journal.)
