Senator. I assume you want to withdraw that one, the one we were discussing earlier on the floor?

SENATOR SCHIMEK: No, Mr. Clerk, 56SS?

CLERK: Yes, you want to offer that.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Just a minute, please. I want to offer an amendment to that amendment.

CLERK: I see. Okay. Mr. President, Senator Schimek has AM56SS that she discussed earlier. I also have an amendment to that amendment by Senator Schimek; Senator, AM81. (See page 158 of the Legislative Journal.)

SENATOR SCHIMEK: That is correct. Thank you, Mr. Clerk. Mr. President and members of the body, you should find on your desk the amendment 81SS, and the language is an amendment to 56SS and what it would do is strike some of the language in that amendment and simply insert "and enrolled in the tuition credit program as of October 1, 1992, shall continue to be entitled to the credit at such rate until completion of the educational program in which he or she is enrolled on October 1, 1992." This, in effect, would let anyone who is currently enrolled in an educational program to continue at that 75 percent rate, and I should explain that the wording "educational program" would apply to a degree program or a certificate program at a technical community college, but it would not apply to just random classes that somebody might be taking. With that, I would be happy to try to answer any questions and would move the adoption of the amendment.

SENATOR CONWAY: Thank you, Senator Schimek. Senator Hillman, your light is on.
