SPEAKER BAACK: Thank you, Senator Coordsen. Senator Haberman.

SENATOR HABERMAN: Mr. President, members of the body, it was mentioned here that the wards of the court program was cut, and that this isn't good and we are cutting another program, the children in the wards of the court still receive a free education. As far as the National Guard is concerned I would ask, all of the entities that were mentioned due to the financial help they receive for getting their education, can they lose an arm, can they lose a leg, can they lose their life, and the answer is no. Due to the financial aid they are receiving, they cannot or do not be put in a position to lose these things, and you do in the National Guard. So I would like to have you think about that. I support LB 10 and the amendment. Thank you.

SPEAKER BAACK: Thank you, Senator Haberman. Seeing no other lights on, I will go to Senator Moore. Do you wish to close?

SENATOR MOORE: Move the bill.
