CLERK: 30 ayes, 0 nays, Madam President, on the suspension of the rules to permit reading today.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Motion is approved, the rules are suspended. Next item on the agenda is Final Reading. I would ask the senators to please be seated so we can proceed. Would the senators please be seated so we can proceed with Final Reading. Would the senators please be seated. We'll proceed with LB 1E.

CLERK: Madam President, Senator Moore would move to return the bill for a specific amendment.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Senator Moore.

SENATOR MOORE: Madam President and members, out there in the real world we always seek perfection and seldom find the perfect 10. Now obviously in here we're expected...we deal with statutes expecting perfection. There's two small omissions in LB 1 I want to announce for the record that can be corrected and aren't a problem. I want to make sure they're aware of them. If you look on page 139 of the Final Reading copy of the bill, lines 10 through 16, the language reduces the appropriation from program 348, medical assistance Department of Social Services pursuant to passage of LB 3. Unfortunately, that's in the wrong budget program. The language should have been in place to page 132 following line 4 which is part of the section dealing with program 347, public assistance, also within DSS. Both of these are rather large aid programs. The difference of \$800,000 will not cause any harm to those programs. There's enough money there to make it work. We will have to come in with our early deficit bill and correct them next year, but they're actually in the wrong programs. We're going to have to increase the one by that amount and decrease the other by that amount in January. And so that's the one problem with the bill that I want you to be aware of that as I said is a problem in where the number went and have to be corrected. But given the size of those budgets, it's not a problem in how things actually operate over in DSS. The second point of information is really obvious when we're dealing with LB 9 and the capital construction projects, we're
