ASSISTANT CLERK:      (Read LB 10 on Final Reading.)

PRESIDENT MOUL:      All provisions of law relative to procedure having been complied with, the question is, shall LB 10 pass? All those in favor please vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Please record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK:      (Read record vote.      See page 173 of the Legislative Journal.) 41 ayes, 3 nays, 3 present and not voting, 2 excused and not voting, Madam President.

PRESIDENT MOUL:      LB 10 passes. LB 11.

CLERK:      Madam President, I have a motion on the desk.      Senator Schellpeper would move to return the bill for a specific amendment.

PRESIDENT MOUL:      Senator Schellpeper.

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER:      Thank you, Madam Chairman and members. I'm going to withdraw this amendment, but I just need to make one last plea to the body to understand that these MIRF funds are put out across the State of Nebraska on a per capita basis. It's the one program where we can get about 50 percent to Omaha and Lincoln and about 50 percent to the rest of the state. And that's about the only way that we can get the cigarette tax funds to the other cities and to the other part of Nebraska. Most generally the other fund, there's only about 14, 15 percent that goes to the rest of Nebraska. But I just once again, this program was not part of the Governor's original budget. I realize that we're having a serious budget and that it needs probably to be part of it, but it wasn't part of the Governor's original budget. I still think you're taking too much from the cities at this time. They're asked to take more than their fair share so I just want you that when you vote to realize that you
