I know it's a tough vote, but it's also a very defining moment of the session for the Legislature. Yes, this is not in the Governor's plan. We cut back, we compromise on the Governor's plan. This is one of the major components to add back to at least get us back up to the \$97.2 million figure. I simply ask for the body's support on LB 1 and I'll withdraw my motion.

CLERK: (Read record vote. See pages 174-75 of the Legislative Journal.) 26 ayes, 19 nays, 2 present and not voting, 2 excused and not voting, Madam President.

PRESIDENT MOUL: LB 11 passes. LB 12.

CLERK: (Read LB 12 on Final Reading.)

PRESIDENT MOUL: All provisions of law relative to procedure having been complied with, the question is, shall LB 12 pass with the emergency clause attached? All those in favor please vote aye, opposed nay. Please record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: (Read record vote. See page 175 of the Legislative Journal.) 47 ayes, 0 nays, 2 excused and not voting, Madam President.

PRESIDENT MOUL: LB 12 passes with the emergency clause attached. LB 13.

CLERK: (Read LB 13 on Final Reading.)
