

Legislature, I just want to briefly make a comment and then withdraw the motion. This measure will ultimately bring us \$5 million of revenue into the General Fund. We were able to work this piece out and I'm grateful for the fact that we're able to bring \$5 million to the table basically at the same time we do better policy. In previous years it's not been noncontroversial and this year I think there was a lot of understanding of the need to take a step forward and improve our policy. Thank you.
