

SENATOR LANDIS: Thank you, Madam President, members of the Legislature. I knew and admired Don Miller a great deal. There's a rare word in the English language, the word fogleman. It comes from the German army in which the manual of arms is taught by one of the sergeants to the rest of the squads without direct instruction but simply by doing the manual of arms over and over again. And I personally will miss him as will the City of Lincoln.
