SENATOR PIRSCH: Thank you, Madam President, members of the body. I felt sad but that I should bring this resolution before the body. I've known Harold J. Daub, Sr., and his wife Eleanor for a long time. They have lived very modestly in the Benson area for many years and their two children, Harold Jr. and Russell, attended Benson High. Harold, Sr., was what we would call a solid citizen. He was a World War II veteran and then became a heavy equipment salesman. Steady, hard working, you didn't read about him in the papers, but he, with his wife, instilled their family values in their two sons and were a stable foundation for them. Both sons became lawyers. Harold, Jr., went into government service for eight years as the Representative to Congress from the 2nd Congressional District. I think it points out that no one can measure how valuable to society and what a father's influence and guidance can mean to his children. Many, many like Harold J. Daub, Sr., have not made any headlines; but his legacy of family values, like millions of other parents in this nation, are the children and their grandchildren who contribute positively to their communities and our country.
