SENATOR HALL: Thank you, Madam President, and members, I appreciate the help of the body and the patience to wait and try to get this portion of our work done. We will be back debating substantive portions of the bill on Monday, and I look forward to that, I think. But, in this case, the committee amendments really are technical in nature. I think they improve the legislation and I would urge the body's adopting.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Hall. We will now vote on the motion to adopt the committee amendments to LB 1. All those in favor please vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Please record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays, Madam President, on adoption of the committee amendments.

PRESIDENT MOUL: The committee amendments are adopted. I will recognize the Speaker again.

SPEAKER BAACK: Yes, Madam President, and colleagues, we will now take up LB 2 which is the bill that simply appropriates the money for the expenses of the session. We're going to go ahead and advance that bill today, too. So we will take up LB 2. Thank you.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Speaker Baack.

CLERK: Madam President, LB 2 introduced by Senator Warner as Chairperson of the Executive Board. (Read title.) The bill was introduced on November 5 of this year, reported directly to General File.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Senator Warner.

SENATOR WARNER: Madam President and members of the Legislature, LB 2 has a total appropriation of \$62,477. It is for, as indicated by the Clerk, for the expense of the special session. It was placed on General File directly without public hearing. It adjusts two programs in the Legislature's appropriation, Program 122, which is a \$33,762 appropriation. By the way, all of this is based on a nine-day session and in the event that the session runs a shorter period why the bill could be amended on Select File to reduce this dollar amount. But 33,700 is Program 122 which would include the mileage, per diem expenditures of the members of the Legislature. And then the
