SENATOR WILL: E & R amendments?

CLERK: Yes, sir.

SENATOR WILL: I move the adoption of the E & R amendments to LB 1.

PRESIDENT MOUL: You've heard the motion to adopt the E & R amendments. All those in favor please say aye. Opposed nay. E & R amendments are adopted.

CLERK: Senator Schrock, I have the amendment that you gave me yesterday. Next item I have is by Senator Schmit.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Senator Schmit. We'll pass over Senator Schmit's amendment at this time. The next amendment, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Madam President, Senator Coordsen would move to amend. (Coordsen amendment, FA2S4, may be found on page 39 of the Legislative Journal.)

PRESIDENT MOUL: Senator Coordsen.

SENATOR COORDSEN: Thank you, Madam President, members of the body. I'm not going to go into quite as long of a dialogue today as what I did yesterday relative to this and related issues. This amendment is an amendment that would exempt breeding livestock from the personal property tax in Nebraska beginning January 1, 1993. There was an error in Senator Elmer's attempt yesterday in that it would have been effective for this year, and that was not the intent of the original bill, nor the...nor my intent. This amendment is, in fact, LB 3 that was introduced and had a hearing before the Revenue Committee. Unless there are questions that people want to ask, I will, at this time, say that that is the opening. Any further comments I would have would be reserved for the closing. Thank you.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Coordsen. Is there anyone who wishes to address this amendment? Seeing none....Does anyone wish to address the amendment? Seeing none, do you have closing, Senator Coordsen?
